

Dear Staff:

I'm writing to urge the NRC to recommend that NO NUCLEAR WASTE be recycled into the marketplace or into local landfills or hazardous waste sites not equipped to take radioactive materials. This means that 0% nuclear waste should be allowed in cement, asphalt, frying pans, eating utensils, dental braces, agricultural land, playgrounds, etc.

Nuclear waste is, literally, too hot to handle. Putting it into items we use every day and places where we congregate would increase the death rate from cancer. We should contain nuclear waste on site wherever possible, not disperse it around the country.
