NEVADA NUCLEAR WASTE STORAGE INVESTIGATIONS (NNWSI) PROJECT WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE WEEK ENDING MARCH 13, 1987

I. Critical Items Status

A. Stop-Work Orders

Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL)--The status of the five remaining scientific investigation planning (SIP) documents and their associated Quality Assurance Level Assignments (QALAs) requiring Waste Management Project Office (WMPO) approval to rescind the stop-work provisions for these activities has not changed since the last Weekly Highlights report, March 10, 1987.

SIPs approved by WMPO SIPs in process

<u>U.S. Geological Survey (USGS)</u>--There are five conditions for lifting the stop-work order on technical and scientific activities. These conditions are as follows:

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- 1. WMPO approval of the proposed USGS audit finding corrective actions,
- 2. Indoctrination and training of personnel,
- 3. WMPO approval of the USGS Quality Assurance Program Plan (QAPP) in response to the audit findings,
- 4. Quality assurance (QA) resource plan, and
- 5. WMPO approval of SIPs and the associated QALAs.

The status of these five conditions is as follows:

- 1. WMPO has accepted all proposed corrective actions,
- 2. USGS has been training personnel since November 1986, and all training should be substantially complete by March 1987,
- 3. WMPO approved the USGS QAPP during October 1986,
- 4. The QA resource plan submitted on February 10, 1987, is under review by WMPO. Comments on the plan will be transmitted to the USGS next week.

Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC)--Nineteen of the SAIC activities have approved SIP and QALA documents. Only one SIP and its associate QALA remain to be approved. Approval of the remaining document is anticipated by March 20, 1987, to rescind the stop-work order.

B. <u>Site Characterization Plan (SCP)</u>

Activities at the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE)/Headquarters (HQ) comment resolution workshop for Section 8.3 of the SCP included discussion of:

- 1. Open issues having schedule impacts;
- 2. Site Characterization Overview Committee review of each issue and comments requiring management's attention; and
- 3. A sign-off for each issue indicating HQ agreement with the proposed revision schedules for the issues and with the workshop agreements in terms of required revisions.

Revisions to various sections of 8.3 will continue on the schedule that workshop leaders presented at the HQ workshop. Data received from participants on activity interfaces in Section 8.3 are currently being put into the data base for use in Section 8.5. Reference verification is continuing.

A meeting was held with HQ management on March 6, 1987, to discuss development of a new success-oriented schedule for the SCP. Due to changes required in Section 8.3, another review cycle will be scheduled. The SCP is not expected to be released to the public until Fall 1987.

A waste package meeting (Section 8.3.4) was held on March 10, at Livermore, CA. Workshops are planned from March 16-27 in Albuquerque to complete performance allocation for design and performance issues, and to mature characterization issue linkages and parameter tables. An HQ comment resolution meeting on Sections 8.4 and 8.7 was held in Las Vegas March 10-11.

Project participants attended an Appendix 7 meeting with NRC representatives at Sandia National Laboratories (SNL) to discuss the Repository Conceptual Design Report.

SNL submitted to WMPO the fiscal year 1987 schedule of external and internal QA audits to be conducted by SNL (Milestone R890).

SAIC submitted the preliminary draft Environmental Regulatory Compliance Plan to WMPO for transmittal to DOE/HQ.

The state of Nevada comments on the Environmental Monitoring and Mitigation Plan were received this week. SAIC staff members are analyzing the comments and preparing responses.
