Dear Mr. Lohaus:

As part of our on-going communications regarding the status of New Hampshire's progress on implementing program improvements in response to the state's Integrated Materials Performance Evaluation Program (IMPEP), I offer you the following:

- An updated Program Improvement Work Plan dated 7/7/03.
- Updated "Licensing Status Monthly Summary Report" and "Monthly Inspection Status Summary Report" dated 7/11/03.
- Radioactive Material License Inspections completed since February 6, 2003
- Radioactive Materials Inspection Schedule – 2nd and 3rd quarters.
- Schedule of Initial Inspections for Newly issued Licensees.

Regarding efforts that we have undertaken or will be undertaking to address workforce issues, business operations, and consistency with NRC regulatory standards:

- In July 2003, the NH Division of Personnel approved the reclassification of the current Bureau Chief position to the new, higher paying, Radiation Health Physicist V level. Because of the new classification, we must follow the rules for recruiting candidates from within the agency. If no internal candidate is selected, the search will be broadened as needed to secure a qualified candidate.
- A new health physicist has been recruited and began working on July 11th. This individual holds a recent doctorate in physics and will be attending NRC courses as soon as we can schedule him for the appropriate training.
- We have several viable candidates for the one other Radiation Health Physicist vacancy, and we will be following up on second interviews within the next week. The recruitment process will continue beyond that date if necessary.
- A contract with a former agreement state director (Ms. Jeffs) was successfully renewed by the Executive Council on June 6th; therefore there has been no interruption in her services.
- Mr. Mario Iannaccone continues to do an outstanding job. His contract was also renewed as of June 24th.
- The Massachusetts program has graciously assisted us in the review of an SSD&R request from BAE Systems. The SSD&R was granted on June 2, 2003.
- We are in the final stages of seeking legislative approval of the rules changes needed to make the Bureau fee-based.

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- The new computer software program, "RADS", is still moving forward. Although RADS has gone through the initial user acceptance phase, there remain usability issues. Bureau supervisors are in the process of meeting with DHHS IT staff to mediate for the needed changes.
- The Rad Materials Section Supervisor, Dennis O'Dowd, is continuing to provide weekly reports, which indicate the assignments each staff member has for the upcoming week and the status of the current week's work. These are reviewed each Friday and I believe are helpful in supporting the staff in prioritizing work assignments. Inspections and inspection report due dates are now scheduled well in advance so as to allow for mid-course corrections, should any be needed.
- The State Radiation Advisory Committee (SRAC) held its last quarterly meeting on June 5, 2003. Members expressed their desire to have an opportunity to assist our efforts in moving the rule changes through the legislative review process and attended the last legislative meeting held on June 23rd. The SRAC members were also concerned about the state's need to improve its performance under the agreement status, and there was considerable discussion as to how to make this happen. The consensus was that we are on the right track.
- In regard to bringing our rules into conformance with those of the NRC, the immediate schedule of events is as follows: 1) All rulemaking notice forms have been submitted to the appropriate legislative office; 2) the official rulemaking notice was published in the July 11, 2003, New Hampshire Rule Register; and 3) the public hearing on the proposed amendments is scheduled for August 1, 2003 in Concord, New Hampshire. This will allow us to adopt 49 CFR 100-189 & 390-397, 10 CFR Subpart D, and 10 CFR 20 Appendices G, B, and C. The remaining rule adoptions needed to achieve full compliance with NRC will be pursued in accordance with the previously reported timeline.

In summary: The state continues to make continuous progress in addressing the issues raised in the 2001 and 2002 IMPEP reports. We believe we are at the point of inflection in terms of moving the rule making process back on track, and we are confident that our remaining vacancies will be filled expeditiously. As Director Dunn has pointed out in previous letters, this progress could not have occurred without the support of the NRC and our own SRAC and licensees.
