### B. Core Sample Management

Staff continued processing Utah Prototype borehole samples at the Sample Management Facility (SMF).

A tour of the SMF was given to a reporter from the <u>Las Vegas</u>
<u>Review-Journal</u>. A tour of the SMF, G-Tunnel, and <u>Climax Mine</u> areas
of the Nevada Test Site (NTS) was conducted for U. S. Department of
Energy (DOE) and Idaho National Engineering Laboratory personnel.
Attendees were briefed on the geology of the NTS area and various
project-related testing at G-Tunnel and Climax mines.

# C. Quality Assurance (QA)

The Bimonthly QA meeting was held in Washington, D.C., on September 7, 1989. A presentation on the Status of Title II Quality Assurance Controls was given to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC).

At this month's Integrated Data System (IDS) Liaison Group meeting, a question arose concerning the requirements of Administrative Procedure 5.19Q, "Interface Control," and the IDS requirement to use Memoranda of Understanding as the main method of communication among project participants. Further research is being conducted to resolve this QA concern.

# D. Exploratory Shaft Facility (ESF)

ESF staff reviewed Holmes & Narver's proposed resolutions to the management review of its general arrangement drawings.

The revised annotated outline of the Waste Package Program Plan was completed.

The final TAR recommendations are complete and the document is being readied for production and distribution.
