OI determined that the allegation that a senior project manager employed at the TVA Corporate Office was the subject of employment discrimination by management after identifying safety concerns was not substantiated. OI SYNOPSIS

This investigation was initiated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Office of Investigations, Region II, on April 22, 2002, to determine if a senior project manager, employed at the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) Corporate Office was discriminated against by management after identifying safety concerns.

Based on a review of the licensee's report of investigation and other related documentation developed during this investigation, the allegation that a senior project manager employed at the TVA Corporate Office was the subject of employment discrimination by management after identifying safety concerns was not substantiated.
