

Fitness for Duty Events (FFD)
Report for Period of January 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003**

Test Results

WCNOC performs random testing of the workforce at an annual rate of at least 50 percent of the workforce in accordance with 10 CFR 26.24(a)(2). For the six-month period beginning January 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2003, random screens were performed for 27.42% of the WCNOC population.

WCNOC submitted blind performance specimens in accordance with 10 CFR 26, Appendix A, Section 2.8(e)(2), requirements. There were no reportable events.

WCNOC Employees

There were no WCNOC employees that tested positive during this reporting period.

During a random screen, one individual could not provide an adequate breath specimen. The individual was referred to the Medical Review Officer to perform an examination to determine if a medical condition existed. Procedures were revised to provide measures to be taken when individuals cannot provide adequate breath specimens.

Contractors

There were no contractors that tested positive during this reporting period.

Fitness For Duty Program Changes

WCNOC implemented the NEI 03-01 requirements. The NRC "Compensatory Measures for Access Authorization" order requires each licensee to enhance their Behavior Observation Program (BOP). WCNOC's Behavior Observation Program is part of the Fitness for Duty Program. BOP/FFD training remains part of Plant Access Training. However, a separate exam is given for the BOP/FFD section to ensure personnel are knowledgeable of the BOP/FFD changes and requirements.

Events Reported In Accordance with 10 CFR 26.73

During this reporting period, there were no reportable violations of the Fitness for Duty program.
