10 CFR 1303 requires that unless specifically excluded from public disclosure, all documents associated with license transfers are to be placed on the NRC Web Site (<u>www.nrc.gov</u>). 10 CFR 1303 also lists the types of documents (e.g., license transfer application, Commission correspondence, etc.) that must be placed on the Web page. Placing the documents in ADAMS does <u>not</u> satisfy the requirement. Because the public cannot access ADAMS directly through the NRC Web site, the requirements of 10 CFR 1303 are not satisfied.

There is a Web page for license transfer documents that is available to the public and is included under Principal Reactor Regulatory Programs. The address is <u>www.nrc.gov/NRC/REACTOR/LTM/index.html.</u> Now we need to put the appropriate documents in it.

Please provide the following information for <u>each</u> piece of documentation that is publically available for a particular license transfer request for which you are responsible. Send the information to the license transfer E-Mail address (License_Transfers).

1. Plant name or names. If there is more than one unit involved, provide the unit numbers (e.g. Catawba 1 and 2, Millstone 1, 2, and 3, etc.)

2. Date of document

3. Document accession number

4. Description of document; for example:

Request from ZYX company for approval of transfer of license to CBA company due to a proposed [merger, sale, etc] to/with OMN company

or

Notice of meeting between the NRC staff and ZYX company to discuss proposed merger, etc.

or

or

Ĵ

Federal Register notice regarding proposed license transfer for, etc.

Decision of the Hearing Board for the CBA/OMN proposed merger

etc.

This request for documents applies only to those license transfer requests that are currently active.

Documents will be kept on the Web page until three months after the NRC activities are complete.
