## FURTHER SCHEDULING ORDER

This Order memorializes determinations on all pending procedural matters, including a stay request, made during a two-hour telephone conference held yesterday morning among the parties, the Presiding Officer, and the Special Assistant. During the conference call, the NRC Staff indicated that it was on the verge of issuing a license to Applicant CFC Logistics, and in observance of the Presiding Officer's August 21 Order Requiring Notice, the Staff advised the Presiding Officer that its intention was to issue the license as early as Wednesday, August 27. For its part, the Applicant committed on the record that if the Staff were to issue the license, no Cobalt 60 would be shipped to the vicinity of the CFC facility prior to the week beginning September 22.

Under these circumstances, and in light of the other unusual aspects of the proceeding discussed during the conference call, the Petitioners' August 22 Motion for Stay is <u>denied</u> without prejudice as premature. After the issuance of the license, Petitioners are free to file an application for a stay of the effectiveness of the license pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.1263 that specifically addresses the four factors set forth in 10 C.F.R. § 2.788(e). To enable the Petitioners to be fully informed in filing that motion, we hereby direct that the portions of the Application that were previously withheld, including the manufacturer drawings of the irradiator components, are to be made available to Petitioners' counsel under an appropriate protective

order that the parties are to negotiate. Persons seeking access to the proprietary information under that protective order are to execute a corresponding nondisclosure affidavit to be filed with the Presiding Officer.

In keeping with the discussions held and the determinations made during yesterday's telephone conference: (1) the Presiding Officer's August 21 Scheduling Order directing the Applicant to respond to the Petitioners' August 21 Motion to Order Release of Documents is <a href="mailto:superceded">superceded</a>; (2) the Presiding Officer's August 25 Order Scheduling Responses to Petitioners' Motion for Stay is <a href="mailto:mooted">mooted</a>; and (3) the Applicant's August 25 oral request for extension of time and page enlargement for responding to the Petitioners' Motion for Stay is <a href="mailto:denied">denied</a> as moot.

Moving forward, the following schedule will govern:

- Pursuant to the Presiding Officer's August 25 Order Granting Request for
  Extension of Time, the Staff will file by Wednesday, August 27, a brief on the
  questions of the Petitioners' standing and the germaneness of their "areas of
  concern."
- The Staff and the Applicant will make available to Petitioners' counsel the withheld portions of the Application, including the manufacturer drawings of the irradiator components, by noon on Thursday, August 28.
- If they wish to, the Petitioners will file a stay motion by noon on Wednesday,
   September 3.
- Pursuant to the Presiding Officer's August 25 Order Granting Request for
  Extension of Time, the Petitioners and the Applicant will file their responses to
  the Staff's standing/germaneness brief at 5:00 PM on Friday, September 5 by
  simultaneous electronic transmission.
- If the Petitioners file a stay motion, the Applicant and the Staff will file their responses by 6:00 PM on Monday, September 8.

 An oral argument on the issues of standing and germaneness and on the motion for stay will be held from 5:30 to 8:00 PM on Wednesday, September 10 at a suitable location to be determined.

It is so ORDERED.
