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## - AFFIDAVIT

I, Robert Joux, Executive Director of the Nevada Nuclear Waste Project Office/Agency for Nuclear Projects, being first duly sworn, do hereby protest water Application No. 52338 filed by the U.S. Department of Energy for a diversion rate of 0.2 cfs and an annual consumptive use not to exceed 30.9 million gallons (95 acre-feet) for the first seven years.

of my protest is that there The basis unappropriated water in the proposed source of supply; the will conflict with existing rights, proposed use particularly private agricultural water rights and federal reserved water rights within the underground water basin; the applicant has not secured the necessary ownership, control and/or jurisdiction over the proposed place of use; and the approval of Application No. 52338 will prove detrimental to the public interest for the following 1) the general public and the Governor of the reasons: State of Nevada adamantly oppose the construction of a high-level nuclear waste repository at Yucca Mountain; 2) the State of Nevada is in litigation with the DOE concerning the requisite institutional land use authorization which encompasses the place of use; 3) the U.S. Department of Energy, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Bureau of Land Management, the Secretary of the Interior, the U.S. Department of Defense, and the National Park Service have not entered into consultation to evaluate whether the activities involved in the withdrawal of water from Well J-13, the proposed source of supply, in the quantities applied for, will jeopardize the continued existence of endangered species and destroy or adversely modify critical habitat in the groundwater basin and Death Valley National Monument, including in these categories but not limited thereto, the pupfish in Devil's Hole; and 4) withdrawals of in the quantities applied for will endangered species and destroy or modify critical habitat. See Cappaert v. United States, 426 U.S. 128 (1976); see also 50 C.F.R. Part 402.
