Dear Mr. Lohaus:

As part of our on-going communications regarding the status of New Hampshire's progress on implementing program improvements in response to the state's Integrated Materials Performance Evaluation Program (IMPEP), I offer you the following enclosures:

- An updated Program Improvement Work Plan dated 9/9/03.
- Updated "Licensing Status Monthly Summary Report" and "Monthly Inspection Status Summary Report" dated 9/9/03.
- Radioactive Material License Inspections Completed in the Year 2003 (as of 9/9/03).
- Radioactive Materials Inspection Schedules -2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 4^{th} quarters of 2003.
- Radioactive Materials Inspection Calendars 3nd and 4th quarters of 2003.
- Current Schedule of Initial Inspections for Newly-Issued Licensees.
- Updated rule adoption matrix/schedule.

In regards to efforts that we have undertaken or will be undertaking to address workforce issues, business operations and consistency with NRC regulatory standards, I offer the following:

- In July 2003, the NH Division of Personnel approved the reclassification of the current Bureau Chief position to the new, higher paying, Radiation Health Physicist V level. The last step in the reclassification process requires the approval of the Governor and Executive Council. Given the overall status of the economy and the need to be prudent in expending state funds, it is uncertain when we should expect final approval.
- At this time, the BRH's health physicist positions are fully staffed. Rick D'Alarcao, who holds a doctorate degree in physics, began working on July 11th; and Debanond Chakraborty, who holds a master's degree in health physics, started on August 22. Rick has been scheduled to attend the following three NRC-sponsored courses this fall: Radiation Safety in Industrial Radiography; Inspection Procedures; and Licensing Practices and Procedures. Also, on September 9, in anticipation of the NRC training schedule to be released in the upcoming federal fiscal year, we have submitted applications to have our newest health physicist, Mr. Chakraborty, attend the same three courses listed above at the next available opening.
- Contract work continues with former agreement state program director (Vicki Jeffs) conducting license pplication reviews on behalf of the radiation control program.

- Contract work continues with Mario Iannaccone conducting inspections of radioactive material licensees on behalf of the program.
- On July 18, 2003, the new fee schedule, which implements the Bureau's fee-based rules, was approved by the Joint Legislative Council on Administrative Rules. The new fee structure is now in place and generating revenue.
- The new computer software program, "RADS", is still moving forward. Although RADS has gone through the initial user acceptance phase, there remain usability issues. Bureau supervisors met recently with DHHS Information Technology staff to mediate for the needed changes, and progress should be noted this month.
- The Radioactive Materials Section Supervisor, Dennis O'Dowd, continues providing weekly reports, which indicate the assignments each staff member has for the upcoming week and the status of the current week's work. These are reviewed each Friday and I believe are helpful in supporting the staff in prioritizing work assignments. In addition, the inspection schedule for the last quarter of 2003 has been completed, which includes initial inspections of newly issued licenses (as per the NRC's Manual Chapter 2800 inspection protocols). Inspections and inspection report due dates are now scheduled well in advance so as to allow for mid-course corrections, should any be needed.
- The State Radiation Advisory Committee (SRAC) held its last quarterly meeting on September 4, 2003. The state's letter to the NRC, dated July 18, 2003, was reviewed by the committee, which then expressed its satisfaction with the progress to date.
- In regard to bringing our rules into conformance with those of the NRC, the immediate schedule of events is as follows: 1) All rulemaking notice forms have been submitted to the appropriate legislative office; 2) the official rulemaking notice was published in the July 11, 2003, New Hampshire Rule Register; 3) the public hearing on the proposed amendments took place on August 1, 2003, and 4) the legislative review of these rules is scheduled for September 18, 2003, in Concord, New Hampshire. This will, in effect, adopt 49 CFR 100-189 & 390-397, 10 CFR Subpart D, and 10 CFR 20 Appendices G, B, and C. The remaining rule adoptions needed to achieve full compliance with NRC will be pursued in accordance with the submitted timeline.

In summary, the state continues to make continuous progress in addressing the issues raised in the 2001 and 2002 IMPEP reports. Please feel free to call me with any questions. 





New Hampshire Rules for the Control of Radiation Rule Adoption Plan

September 9, 2003

As stated in letter dated April 28, 2003, an action plan has been developed that will address all BRH rules (the New Hampshire Rules for the Control of Radiation) that are associated with NRC regulations. Bureau of Radiological Health Rules that are lapsed will be addressed first. This initial phase includes:

* There are presently no plans for the operation of a Low Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Site within the State of New Hampshire.

Part He-P 4070, which revised the licensing and registration fee schedule, (including introducing fees for reciprocity), was adopted on July 18, 2003, this being the final essential step necessary to make the Bureau fee-based. As for the rules listed above, we are currently at the final rule-making stages, as the Joint Legislative Committee on Administrative Rules (JLCAR) hearing on these rules is scheduled for September 18, 2003.

With regard to other necessary rule revisions, the Bureau is currently pursuing a two-phase approach for the 11 overdue, recommended changes to current rules.

These changes to rulemaking include:

- Timeliness in Decommissioning of Materials Facilities
- Low-Level Waste Shipment Manifest Information and Reporting
- Termination or Transfer of Licensed Activities
- Resolution of Dual Regulation of Airborne Effluents of Radioactive Materials, Clean Air Act
- Recognition of Agreement State Licenses In Area Under Exclusive Federal Jurisdiction Within an Agreement State
- Criteria for the Release of Individuals Administered Radioactive Materials
- Radiological Criteria for License Termination
- Deliberate Misconduct of Unlicensed Persons
- Minor Corrections, Clarifying Questions, and a Minor Policy Change
- Transfer for Disposal and Manifests: Minor Technical Conforming Amendment
- Respiratory Protection and Controls to Restrict Internal Exposures

These requirements will be evaluated as to their applicability to Bureau rules. Due the recent efforts needed for approval of the fee revisions, and to move forward with the expired regulations, as was decided at the rulemaking planning meeting held on August 18, 2003, these rule changes above will be proposed for submittal to the Joint Legislation Committee on Administrative Rules for approval and adoption no later than February 29, 2004.

The changes to current State rules that are not overdue will be pursued following the completion of the previous rule changes. These changes to rulemaking include:

- Energy Compensation Sources for Well Logging and Other Regulatory Clarifications.
- New Dosimetry Technology.
- Requirements for Certain Generally Licensed Industrial Devices Containing Byproduct Material.
- Revision to the Skin Dose Limit.
- Medical Use of Byproduct Material.
