RE: Draft Environmental Assessment Dealing With Core Laboratories, Inc.

Dear Mr. Collins:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you that staff members of the Utah Division of Radiation Control have reviewed a draft Environmental Assessment releating to a license amendment request proposed by Core Laboratories, Inc. (dba Pro Technics) of Houston, Texas. The licensee requested approval of an additional disposal alternative that involves injection of well returns containing radioactive tracer material into Class II disposal well that have been approved to accept nonhazardous oil and gas waste by State Agencies.

In general, we support the conclusions presented in the Environmental Assessment. For more specific comments, we believe it is important that the applicant develop and utilize appropriate procedures to address or contain any spills of radioactive well returns when injecting into a Class II disposal well. We assume that the applicant will inject the beads by fracturing the formation to emplace them. While this may work well in some states, such as Alaska where they routinely inject over parting pressure and inject wastes such as cuttings, etc., it may not be applicable in Utah. The Division of Oil Gas and Mining of the Utah Department of Natural Resources does not routinely allow injection over parting pressure and, when approved, requires somewhat special circumstances and additional permitting to do so.
