A CONCUPRENT RESOLUTION TO URGE THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY AND THE NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION TO FULFILL THEIR OBLIGATION TO ESTABLISH A PERMANENT REPOSITORY FOR NIGHLEVEL NUCLEAR WASTE

WHEREAS, Over the past four decades, nuclear power has become a significant source for the nation's production of electricity. Michigan is among the majority of states that derive energy from nuclear plants; and

WHEREAS, Since the earliest days of nuclear power, the great different associated with this technology is how to deal with it is waste material that is produced. This high-level radioactive waste material demands exceptional care in all facets of its storage and disposal, including the transportation of this material, and

WHEREAS, In 1982, Congress passed the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982. This legislation requires the federal government, through the Department of Energy, to build a facility for the permanent storage of high-level nuclear waste. This act, which was amended in 1987, includes a specific simulable to Identify a suitable location and to establish the waste facility. The costs for this undertaking are to be paid from a fee that is assessed on all nuclear energy produced; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the federal act, customers of utilities operating nuclear plants in Michigan have contributed, directly and through accumulated interest, some \$700 million for the construction and operation of a federal waste facility; and

WHEREAS. There are serious concerns that the federal government is not complying with the timetables set torth in federal law. Every delay places our country at greater fails, because the large number of temporary alles at nuclear facilities across the country makes us vulnerable to potential problems. The Department of Energy, working with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, shust not fail to meet its obligation as provided by law. There is too much at states, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES (the Senate concurring), That we urge the United States Department of Energy and the Mucleer Regulatory Commission to fulfill their obligation to establish a permanent repository for high-level nuclear weste; and be it further

FESCLYED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the United States Department of Energy, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the President of the United States Sensie, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and the members of the Michigan congressional delegation.
