
Dear Mr. Dyer:

I am writing this letter on behalf of myself, my wife and our extended family all of whom live directly downwind of the Davis-Besse nuclear power plant. We have lived in the shadow of Davis-Besse since it was built. We have followed the shenanigans of its owners from the beginning of construction until now including the two near meltdowns and various other "incidents". Each event was followed by a promise to operate the plant safely. All these statements regarding safer operation were lies. Nothing changed and the danger to us all is as strong today as it ever was. 



The plant is a major concern of everyone in N.E. Ohio, based upon the experiences, and its problems. As you know, on March 6, 2002, there was a hole discovered and Boric acid leaked through cracked pipes, leaving only three eights of an inch of stainless steel cladding to seal the reactor. This could have lead to a meltdown, had the cooling system not have worked. There have been two such incidents in the past, where the public has come close to being exposed to deadly nuclear material.

My family has donated to help put out the word that the plant should not come on line, and if you allow this, we are willing to do whatever it takes to get this plant shut down, as it should be. It is not worth endangering human lives, after all, haven't Americans lost enough in the past two years, to take any chance at losing lives. Moreover, if you let this come on line, and the unthinkable happens, I think that you would find yourself in a position that would in fact create moral and legal issues that would *overwhelm* you. The plant is a major concern of everyone in N.E. Ohio, based upon the experiences, and its problems. As you know, on March 6, 2002, there was a hole discovered and Boric acid leaked through cracked pipes, leaving only three eights of an inch of stainless steel cladding to seal the reactor. This could have lead to a meltdown, had the cooling system not have worked. There have been two such incidents in the past, where the public has come close to being exposed to deadly nuclear material.

My family has donated to help put out the word that the plant should not come on line, and if you allow this, we are willing to do whatever it takes to get this plant shut down, as it should be. It is not worth endangering human lives, after all, haven't Americans lost enough in the past two years, to take any chance at losing lives. Moreover, if you let this come on line, and the unthinkable happens, I think that you would find yourself in a position that would in fact create moral and legal issues that would *overwhelm* you. Thus, this is not a small matter, and you must considered the "what if's", and make your decision base upon possible lost to human life, and not costs of providing energy.






