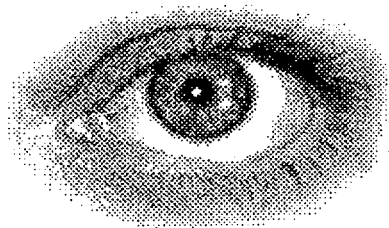

My wife and I are very concerned about the health risks posed by unsafe ~~safe~~ practices at the Davis-Besse Nuclear Plant. We are concerned particularly about six-by-five inch cavity found in the reactor head that lead to the closing of the facility. It is very frightening to us that this incident was the closest the U.S. has come to a nuclear power accident since Three Mile Island. While we are aware that nuclear energy is a potentially safe energy source, we are not satisfied that adequate safeguards have been taken to ensure public safety at Davis-Besse. It is more worrisome that BKE, Inc. + Nuclear Maintenance Integration reported claims to the NRC have not been taken seriously. In addition, the discovery of radioactive particles on worker's clothing that were found outside the plant is just another indication of how safety is not a primary concern at the plant.

As citizens of Northeast Ohio, we will not stand for unsafe nuclear practices that could endanger all of our lives. We demand that the Davis-Besse nuclear plant be closed down permanently. We have lost trust in the current management and we feel that Davis-Besse will never be safe as long as First Energy is at the helm. Our lives are more important than their profits.

### **NRC DISPATCHES INSPECTOR TO DAVIS-BESSE NUCLEAR POWER STATION FOLLOWING DISCOVERY OF RADIOACTIVE PARTICLES OFF-SITE**

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission is reviewing an incident in which microscopic radioactive particles were recovered from four individuals, their clothing, residences and hotel rooms after leaving the Davis-Besse nuclear power plant in Ohio.

Radiation protection personnel at the Davis-Besse plant were notified on March 22 by the Oconee nuclear facility in South Carolina that discrete radioactive particles were found on a worker's sleeve. The worker was undergoing in-processing for work at the Oconee facility, and had last worked at Davis-Besse.

FirstEnergy Nuclear Operating Company operates the Davis-Besse nuclear power plant near Oak Harbor, Ohio. The licensee's investigation to date has determined that a total of 13 discrete particles were recovered from four individuals, their clothing, residences and hotel rooms in Ohio, South Carolina, Texas and Virginia. The individuals had worked on steam generators at Davis-Besse, which shut down in mid-February for a refueling outage.

A senior health physicist from the NRC's Region III Office in Lisle, IL, has been dispatched to the Davis-Besse plant to assess the possible dose consequences to the four contract employees who visited Davis-Besse before traveling to other sites and to evaluate the licensee's investigation into the matter. FirstEnergy is attempting to determine how the particles were transported off-site.

Preliminary dose calculations by the licensee indicate no adverse health effects are expected to either the workers or members of the public from the tiny particles. The particles are believed to be byproducts of the fission process with relatively low levels of activity.

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## Davis-Besse nears record for duration of shutdown

Toledo- FirstEnergy's Davis-Besse nuclear power plant is about to break its record for consecutive days without producing electricity.

On Wednesday, Davis-Besse will have sat idle for 565 days. The record was 564 consecutive days between June 9, 1985, and Dec. 25, 1986.

The cost of the current outage is more than \$500 million, and is starting to approach the \$642 million price tag that it cost to build the plant in 1977.

The 1985-86 shutdown occurred after a series of pumps and valves failed, causing a loss of coolant water to the reactor core of the plant, 30 miles east of Toledo near Oak Harbor.

Then-operator Toledo Edison Co. restarted the plant Christmas Day 1986, but it struggled with shutdowns on and off into early January 1987.

The plant has been shut down since February 2002. A month later a leak was discovered that had allowed boric acid to eat nearly through the 6-inch-thick steel cap covering the plant's reactor vessel.

FirstEnergy originally announced plans to return the plant to service in April 2002, but that date has been pushed back repeatedly because of other problems and Nuclear Regulatory Commission scrutiny.

FirstEnergy will make a presentation about its progress Sept. 18 at the agency's Midwest regional office in Lisle, Ill. The agency will meet again to give the company feedback before restart, agency spokesman Jan Strasma said.

### Close Call: Monitoring Nuclear Reactors

Ohio's Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station was shut down last year because of the most extensive corrosion ever discovered at a nuclear power plant. The facility was closed after workers found a six-by-five inch cavity in its reactor head that eventually could have caused a meltdown — the closest the U.S. has come to a nuclear accident since Three Mile Island in 1979. This week FirstEnergy, which operates the plant, postponed a scheduled refueling of the reactor, which once supplied electricity to 150,000 people. "Close Call" investigates the Davis-Besse incident to uncover whether industry profits were put before public safety and examines concerns about the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's ability to effectively monitor all of the nation's nuclear reactors.

Currently, there are 103 (104 if Davis-Besse comes back on-line) commercial nuclear reactors producing electricity in the United States, located at 64 sites in 31 states. Today, nuclear power plants — the second largest source of electricity in the U.S. — supply about 20% of the nation's electricity each year. Nuclear energy is the world's largest source of emission-free energy, producing no controlled air pollutants or greenhouse gases. The use of nuclear energy in place of other energy sources helps to keep the air clean, preserve the Earth's climate, avoid ground-level ozone formation and prevent acid rain.

Nuclear technology uses the energy released by splitting the atoms of certain elements. First developed in the 1940s, research initially focussed on producing bombs by splitting the atoms of either uranium or plutonium. In the 1950s, attention turned to the peaceful uses of nuclear fission, notably for power generation. Today, the world produces as much electricity from nuclear energy as it did from all sources combined in 1960.

The United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) regulates U.S. commercial nuclear power plants and the civilian use of nuclear materials. The NRC considers public involvement a crucial part of their mission, and you can report a safety or security concern involving a nuclear facility or radioactive materials on the NRC Web site. ## Davis-Besse flaws were well-known, lawsuit says

### Contractor detailed problems in '88 report

FirstEnergy Corp. has known for years that Davis-Besse had design flaws that made the nuclear plant vulnerable to disaster, according to a South Carolina contractor who claims his firm was banned from the site in the fall of 1988 after he had documented alleged shortcomings in a progress report.

William N. Keisler, president of BKE, Inc., and Nuclear Maintenance Integration Consultants Corp., said in a lawsuit filed in Ottawa County Common Pleas Court that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission was kept largely in the dark by FirstEnergy and one of its subsidiaries, Toledo Edison Co., which operated Davis-Besse.

Davis-Besse's work force historically has been reluctant to come forward because of retribution fears, according to the lawsuit. The NRC has said it will not tolerate that kind of intimidation, and that any lingering signs of it must be overcome before it will allow the plant to be restarted.

But the NRC has not been totally oblivious to the problems, either, according to the lawsuit. The suit claims several allegations Mr. Keisler has reported to the NRC's regional office near Chicago since 1992 have gone nowhere. The matter has been referred to the NRC's Office of Inspector General, according to a letter by William D. Travers, the agency's executive director for operations, to U.S. Sen. George Voinovich (R., Ohio).

"The whole issue of safety culture is obviously the highest, most dominant factor," Mr. Keisler told The Blade last night during an interview in which he claimed the beleaguered plant's current state of affairs has, in large part, been shrouded in secrecy since he worked there from March, 1986, through October, 1988.

The lawsuit demands in excess of \$25,000 for each of six counts listed against FirstEnergy, including alleged violations of state and federal whistleblower laws, breach of contract, fraud, negligence, and other infraction claims.

It said three members of Toledo Edison's senior management team - none of whom is still with FirstEnergy - objected to a 1987 report Mr. Keisler had prepared for the company while he was under contract. Called a preventive maintenance program review, the report outlined shortcomings with design issues, equipment, and labor-management relations after the June 9, 1985, temporary loss of auxiliary feed-water incident at Davis-Besse - at the time, the nation's closest brush with a nuclear accident since Three Mile Island in 1979.

That 1985 event has been surpassed by the near-hole in Davis-Besse's reactor
