The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission is publishing in the Federal Register the

enclosed proposed rulemaking that would amend 10 CFR Part 35, "Medical Use of Byproduct

Material." The proposed rule would amend the regulations governing the medical use of

byproduct material to change requirements for recognition of speciality boards whose

certification may be used to determine the adequacy of the training and experience of

individuals to serve as an authorized user, authorized medical physicist, authorized nuclear

pharmacist, or radiation safety officer. Changes are also proposed to the requirements for

demonstrating the adequacy of training and experience pathways other than the board

certification pathway. This rule addresses an issue raised by the Advisory Committee on

Medical Uses of Isotopes, concerning recognition of speciality boards for training and

experience.
