20 Steefel, Levitt & Weiss (the "Firm") respectfully submits its Cover Sheet Application (the
21 "Application") for Allowance and Payment of Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of
22 Expenses for the Period October 1-31, 2003 (the "Application Period"). In support of the
23 Application, the Firm respectfully represents as follows:

24 1. The Firm is Special Counsel to the debtor and debtor-in-possession in the above-
25 referenced bankruptcy case (the "Debtor"). The Firm hereby applies to the Court for allowance
26 and payment of interim compensation for services rendered and reimbursement of expenses
27 incurred during the Application Period.

2. The Firm billed a total of \$48,497.48 in fees and expenses during the Application Period. The total fees represent 162.74 hours expended during the Application Period. These fees and expenses break down as follows:

If such an objection is filed, Debtor is authorized to pay the amounts, if any, not subject to the objection. Upon the conclusion of this case, the Firm will seek fees and reimbursement of the expenses incurred for the totality of the services rendered in the case. 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
Firm (along with the Firm's retainer) will be credited against such final fees and expenses as may be allowed by this Court.


