Dear Mr. Prato,

I have the pleasure to invite you to participate, as a consultant, in a meeting to discuss the draft guidance on a security walk-down procedure in connection with the self-assessment guidelines for the physical protection of nuclear installations against sabotage and to assess the usefulness of the walk down procedure in a nuclear power plant. The main purpose of security walk-down is to identify power plant structures, systems and components vulnerable to malicious acts. The walk-down process is also crucial to eliminate those structures, systems and components, which would not be vulnerable to sabotage events at the nuclear facility.

The meeting is planned to take place at the Korea Institute of Nuclear Safety (KINS), which will host it during 10-14 November 2003 in Daejon, Korea. This meeting is aimed to carry out technical discussion, review draft security walk-down procedures prepared by the Agency and revise the procedure. It will also include a demonstration walk-down at a NPP in Korea.

The Agency will reimburse USNRC for your travel and per diem in accordance with the Agency's procedures for non-staff travel.

This arrangement does not constitute, and shall not be construed to create, an employment relation between the Agency and yourself. Accordingly, the Agency will not pay employer's contribution to any social security scheme or health insurance scheme in connection with services performed by you under this arrangement. Moreover, the Agency will not pay any compensation in the event of death, injury or illness incurred in connection with your services as a consultant. However, while travelling under the authority and at the request of the Agency, you will be covered under the Agency's insurance policy for, inter alia, permanent total disability or death up to an amount of US \$100,000 and medical expenses up to an amount of US \$10,000 in the event of an accident related to such travel, subject to the terms of the insurance policy.
