RESPONSE TO NRC BULLETIN 2003-01, POTENTIAL IMPACT OF DEBRIS BLOCKAGE ON EMERGENCY SUMP RECIRCULATION AT PRESSURIZED-WATER REACTORS – SUPPLEMENTAL LETTER

South Carolina Electric & Gas Company (SCE&G) acting for itself and as agent for South Carolina Public Service Authority, hereby submits a correction letter to the Bulletin response referenced above. Verification activities occurring during the current refueling outage have identified an incorrect sequence in the referenced letter. This sequence describes containment closeout activities prior to Mode 4 of various plant organizations. These activities include walkdown inspections and documentation to confirm that foreign material and debris have been removed as appropriate.

The correct sequence for this activity is that once plant maintenance and modification activities are completed, the Quality Control organization is notified by outage management to perform the containment closeout inspection (actually two part - preliminary and final). This inspection is performed in accordance with Quality Systems procedure (QSP) 522. After the final QC inspection, the entire Reactor Building is declared and maintained a foreign materials exclusion (FME) area.

The operations closeout inspection, performed in accordance with Surveillance Test procedure (STP) 109.001, is performed after completion, or in conjunction with the final QC walkdown inspection, and is the final inspection performed before the lights are turned off in the Reactor Building.
