SUMMARY

By application dated January 14, 2004, Duratek, Inc., requested a revision to the Certificate of Compliance No. 5805 for the Model No. CNS 3-55 package. Duratek did not request any design changes to the package. The certificate has been renewed for a five year term.

EVALUATION

Duratek requested renewal of Certificate of Compliance No. 5805 for the Model No. CNS 3-55 by application dated January 14, 2004. Duratek did not request any design changes to the package.
