I missed the very beginning of the meeting and so I didn't hear everything Tom Smith was saying. Anyway, my feeling is that the primary reason we are not going to review material on the fiche is that it is simply impractical (too much material). However, I would not then default to saying all the material will be released. This is where we can work with the PDR staff, develop the matrix that Lynn S. had brought to the meetings, or otherwise come up with a way for the PDR staff to know when material can be freely released and when they might want to consult with a program office. This said, I would revise the first paragraph to something like;

A systematic review of agency records currently stored on microfiche is not practical. The staff will process requests for such records on a case-by-case basis. In order to minimize impacts on the public, the staff will review selected documents or document types that are likely to be requested from the PDR. These documents, or redacted versions thereof, would then be freely available upon request from the PDR. ... Additionally, the staff does not believe that it is practical to attempt to recall or control archival collections of documents that are currently held external to the agency.

I wouldn't make any special mentions of the FSARs.
