The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) staff has completed the plant-specific Supplement 15 to NUREG-1437, "Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants," regarding the renewal of operating license NPF-12 for the Virgil C. Summer Nuclear Station, for an additional 20 years of operation. Enclosed is a copy of the final report and the associated *Federal Register* Notice of Availability. The notice advises the public that the final report is available for public inspection in the Commission Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Records component of NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS). ADAMS is accessible from the NRC Web site at <a href="http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm.html">http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm.html</a> (the Public Electronic Reading Room).

As discussed in Section 9.3 of this report, the staff recommends that the Commission determine that the adverse environmental impacts of license renewal for the Virgil C. Summer Nuclear Station are not so great that preserving the option of license renewal for energy planning decision makers would be unreasonable. This recommendation is based on: (1) the analysis and findings in the GEIS; (2) the Environmental Report submitted by South Carolina Electric & Gas Company (SCE&G); (3) consultation with Federal, State, and local agencies; (4) the staff's own independent review; and (5) the staff's consideration of public comments.

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A separate notice of filing of the final environmental impact statement will be placed in the *Federal Register* through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. ## NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF THE FINAL SUPPLEMENT 15 TO THE GENERIC ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT REGARDING LICENSE RENEWAL FOR THE VIRGIL C. SUMMER NUCLEAR STATION

Notice is hereby given that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has published a final plant-specific supplement to the "Generic Environmental Impact Statement (GEIS)", NUREG-1437, regarding the renewal of operating license NPF-12 for Virgil C. Summer Nuclear Station (V. C. Summer), for an additional 20 years of operation.

V. C. Summer is owned by South Carolina Electric and Gas Company (SCE&G), and is located in Fairfield County, South Carolina, approximately 26 miles northwest of Columbia, South Carolina. Possible alternatives to the proposed action (license renewal) include no action and reasonable alternative methods of power generation.

It is stated in Section 9.3 of the report:

Based on (1) the analysis and findings in the GEIS (NRC 1996; 1999); (2) the Environmental Report submitted by SCE&G (SCE&G 2002b); (3) consultation with Federal, State, and local agencies; (4) the staff's own independent review; and (5) the staff's consideration of public comments, the staff recommends that the Commission determine that the adverse environmental impacts of license renewal for V. C. Summer are not so

great that preserving the option of license renewal for energy planning decisionmakers would be unreasonable.
