The Washington Nuclear Waste Advisory Council will meet informally on July 16 at 6 p.m. No formal agenda will be followed and discussion topics will be "open".

On July 17 at 9:30 a.m., Washington's Advisory Council and the Oregon Advisory Committee will meet to discuss recent developments involving siting a nuclear waste repository at Hanford and to address the question of what is to be done with radioactive defense wastes already stored at Hanford.

On July 17 at 2 p.m., following the joint meeting, the Washington Nuclear Waste Advisory Council will meet to discuss the U.S. Department of Energy's (USDOE) Defense Waste Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) and the outcome of state meetings held to review defense waste issues with the public. The meeting will be adjourned at 5 p.m. on July 17. If needed the Council will meet in Lacey (Washington) at the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council Hearings Room, 4224-6th Avenue, Building 1, at 9:30 a.m. on July 18 for its regular meeting.

The public is welcome to attend all the meetings and encouraged to comment.
