Enclosed is a copy of Maryland's license conditions that are being used to fulfill the requirements of the general license Rule.

The licensee shall report to the Department all transfers of the devices distributed under this license to persons generally licensed under Section C.22(d) in accordance with Section C.28(d)(4). Such reports shall identify each general licensee by name and address, the type of device transferred, the quantity and type of radioactive material contained in the device, and specific location where each device is installed. The report shall be submitted within 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter in which any such device is transferred to a generally licensed person. In addition to the above, the licensee shall comply with all requirements specified in 10 CFR Part 32.52(a) & (b).

We believe that the use of these license conditions satisfies the compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of State and Tribal Programs (STP) Procedure SA-200.
