AFFECTED INDIAN TRIBES EXPRESS VIEWS ON NUCLEAR WASTE REPOSITORY

DATE: January 16, 1986

The Washington State Nuclear Waste Board and Advisory Council will host a presentation by the Yakima Indian Nation, the Umatilla Indian Tribal Council, and the Nez Perce Tribe. Under the federal Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982, an "affected Indian tribe" means:

"any Indian tribe whose federally defined possessory or usage rights to other lands outside of the reservation's boundaries arising out of congressionally ratified treaties may be substantially and adversely affected by the locating

of such a facility a repository for high-level waste". The three tribes have been designated as affected Indian tribes and have expressed concerns about U.S. Department of Energy efforts to locate a repository at Hanford in southeastern Washington State.

The tribal presentation will focus on unique tribal concerns, including possible violation of treaty rights and impacts on tribal cultural activities. Many of their technical concerns parallel those expressed by the state Nuclear Waste Board. These include a complex and unstable geology, possible contamination of groundwater and the Columbia River, and transportation of radioactive wastes.

The Nuclear Waste Board, the Advisory Council, and the public will have an opportunity to ask questions after the presentation. The public is encouraged to attend.
