Subject: Device Registration			
<p>Summary:</p> <p>The licensee requested authorization to possess a Rapiscan device. I had discussed the status of this device on February 24, 2004 with John Fassal of the State of California, who stated that Ancore (the vendor) has requested registration of the device, but it has not yet been evaluated. Additionally, John told me that Ancore's CA license does not authorize distribution of the device.</p> <p>I called the RSO to discuss these issues. He stated that the device will not be used on site until it is approved. I told him that we can not authorize the device on a license, even for storage until it is approved pursuant to 10 CFR 32.210.</p> <p>He stated that the device is at their facilities in Arizona for testing under reciprocity. I told him that if their facilities are in exclusive federal jurisdiction, the vendor must have filed for reciprocity with the NRC and not with AZ state because States do not have jurisdiction at such facilities.</p> <p>I told him that their alternate training criteria for the trainers is acceptable and we can amend their license to approve only this part of their request. He stated that it will be fine with him if we approve the request in part and he will submit another request later when the device is approved for distribution.</p>
