Gentlemen:

In accordance with Byproduct Materials License No. 37-2416-2, the Research Division of the Curtiss-Wright Corporation presently holds approximately 4,400 curies of government-owned cobalt-60, 11,000 curies of Curtiss-Wright owned cobalt-60, and 50 curies of other byproduct material in the Research Reactor and Radioactive Materials Laboratory Building at Quehanna, Pennsylvania. These materials are stored in a locked hot cell in said building.

The Curtiss-Wright Corporation is presently completing detailed arrangements preparatory to donating the Research Reactor and Radioactive Materials Laboratory to the Pennsylvania State University, University Park, Pennsylvania. Transfer of title is planned as soon as Pennsylvania State University is licensed to receive the special nuclear material and byproduct materials needed in conjunction with operation of such a facility.

The Curtiss-Wright Corporation is making every effort to dispose of the byproduct material prior to transfer of the building title to Pennsylvania State University, however, there is a possibility that all arrangements will not be completed by that time. The Curtiss-Wright Corporation, Research Division, has requested, and the Pennsylvania State University has agreed, that in the event final disposal of the material has not been completed prior transfer of title the material be permitted to remain in the facility in temporary storage pending final disposition.

The Curtiss-Wright Corporation, Research Division, respectfully requests amendment of Byproduct Material License 37-2416-2 to authorize storage of license material in the Research Reactor and Radioactive Materials Laboratory Building at Quehanna, Pennsylvania, subsequent to the date on which title to the building is transferred

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to the Pennsylvania State University. Curtiss-Wright Corporation license material will be stored in a separate area, segregated from license material stored or used in the building under any other license, in locked shielded storage containers. The material to be stored under these conditions will be that license material which remains in the building as of the date of transfer of title, and storage of the material will be on a temporary basis until it can be transferred to other byproduct material licensees.
