Dear Chairman Diaz:

On March 3, I sent a letter requesting a Commission meeting to discuss several important issues related to the design basis threat (DBT). Since that time, the industry has met five times with NRC staff and senior NRC management; are continuing to meet almost daily; and are making progress on reaching closure on the DBT issues.

While we are encouraged by the progress being made with the staff, final decisions on key issues relating to implementation of the DBT have yet to be made. The industry is in a time critical period as licensees have only six weeks to complete their revised security plans, which includes management review, prior to the April 29 date for plan submittal. We cannot allow open policy issues to remain unresolved if the Commission expects licensees to respond within the required time.

Therefore, we are requesting a meeting with the Commission, preferably on March 25 or 26 to address any unresolved policy issues. One key issue already identified is the minimal credit given to the insider mitigation program with respect to vehicle access. We are continuing to work with the staff on the implementation details of the program; however, the appropriate amount of credit for the program is a policy issue that needs to be resolved by the Commission.
