Subject: LICENSING, 6-2543-2, 6-50-1 and 6-50-2

Dear Mr. Davis:

Thank you for your letter dated January 19, 1959, clarifying the licensing position of the Fox and CAMEL Projects.

Though our files contain correspondence concerning the licensing, or exemption from licensing, of Fox and CAMEL, it appears that we have no document which states that work performed under the Fox Project had been moved to CAMEL in Middletown, Connecticut in May of 1957. We will, however, accept your letter of January 19, 1959 as a authority that this transfer took place. Hence, since all work with radioisotopes is now being performed either at CAMEL or at Livermore, which are exempt from licensing requirement, no by-product material license is needed. The subject licenses, therefore, will not have to be renewed.

We wish to advise that if Pratt and Whitney is using or desires to use, radioisotopes in facilities outside of CAMEL, it should first apply for and obtain a byproduct material license from the Atomic Energy Commission.

We appreciate your assistance and cooperation in these matters.
