Your letter of May 6, 1950 to Mr. George R. Hill has been referred to me for attention. I was rather surprised to learn of your refusal to accept the description of the reactor site which we submitted in our letter of February 11, 1960, since our submittal was made to meet the requirement of the Atomic Energy Act for a definitive description of a reactor site licensed by the Atomic Energy Commission. The original description in our application, which appeared on page 48 of our Hazards Evaluation Report, was a general topographical description of an eighty square mile area, and we now propose to give you an exact metes and bounds description of the reactor site based on a survey made subsequent to the date of our original application.

It should also be of interest that this company has obtained nuclear indemnity insurance on the assumption that the description submitted by us was merely a required qualification of our original application.

We ask, therefore, that you accept this amendment with the understanding that, if future Commission regulations require further amendments defining the location of the reactor site, such amendments will be made in accordance with the regulations then in effect.
