

- For each essential IIT position, at least 5-10 individuals have been IIT trained or participated in an actual IIT. Additional qualified individuals have been identified as team leaders and members.
- A relatively small number of individuals who have received IIT training actually have had an IIT experience.
- Many individuals on the IIT “roster” are believed to be eligible for retirement.
- Although anecdotal, most attendees at the last IIT class (February 2003) were highly complimentary of the IIT training program.
- A portion of the IIT training duplicates some of the root cause analysis training taught in other courses.

NSIR/DIRO and HR have concluded that the biennial IIT training cycle can be modified to once per five years with the option of scheduling another course within that period if circumstances warrant, and still preserve adequate IIT capability. Additionally, it seems reasonable to reinstate the IIT refresher and offer it on a biennial basis. Although the curriculum needs to be established, content could include review of some experiences of the previous IITs, cover the root cause analysis, and provide limited role play. The refresher will be offered to individuals whose IIT training or actual IIT participation is close to or over ten years old. It will run for three to five days and be offered at the Professional Development Center (PDC) or in the Regions, as appropriate.

The cost savings associated with this modified approach is expected to be greater than \$150K for a five-year period and will also yield reduced travel expenses for the attendees.
