I'm glad to hear it. Are you going to re-convene the group to discuss the impact of what OHS just released?

NSIR

There is one interesting impact that we should discuss, at least with OGC. OHS defined SHSI, then describing marking and handling of the information, including storage and transmission. Their draft guideline also discussed what FOIA exemptions would be appropriate. Those are all the things we were trying to achieve. There's been some discussion of shoe-horning this "sensitive" material into 2.790(d)(1) to protect it from release. However, if we mark it as SHSI, store it as SHSI, and control transmission and handle it as SHSI, treating it as 2.790(d)(1) would be redundant. I would like Mary Pat to consider the legal implications of us just following OHS's guideline, including marking, etc, and protect the information from release on that basis, without leaning on 2.790 to do so.
