presented at this meeting was also explicitly referenced in the NRC proposed Order. As we have discussed with the NRC Project Manager, this meeting presentation contained numerous references to ongoing sub-activities associated with Thermo-Lag corrective actions, as well as detailed sub-activity schedules, which were dynamic in nature and not intended to be relied upon as detailed commitments. As such, we do not believe it would be appropriate to reference this handout material as containing the commitments necessary to close out our Thermo-Lag corrective actions. Accordingly, we believe that the corrective actions described in our letter of June 25, 1997, more adequately describe, in an appropriate level of detail, those actions necessary to resolve Thermo-Lag issues. Importantly, we remain committed to complete walkdowns, evaluations, and upgrades by June 30, 1999.

Accordingly, I have executed and enclosed a revised Consent to a Confirmatory Order, which references the corrective actions described in our June 25, 1997, letter. This matter has been coordinated with the NRC Project Manager, who agrees with the change.

CONSENT TO CONFIRMATORY ORDER MODIFYING LICENSE
(TAC NOS. M85604 AND M85605)

I, Masoud Bajestani, Site Vice President, Sequoyah Nuclear Plant, hereby agree on behalf of the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) that TVA will comply with the following commitment:

The Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) shall complete final implementation of Thermo-Lag 330-1 fire barrier corrective actions at the Sequoyah Nuclear Plant, Units 1 and 2, as described in the TVA submittal dated June 25, 1997. Walkdowns, evaluations, and upgrades will be completed by June 30, 1999.

TVA also agrees to incorporating this commitment into a Confirmatory Order Modifying License (Order) that will be effective immediately upon issuance. I recognize that by signing below, TVA consents to the issuance of an immediately effective Order incorporating the above commitment for each Sequoyah unit and, by doing so, pursuant to 10CFR2.202(a)(3), TVA will not have a right to request a hearing on all or any part of this Order.
