We seek information concerning The Pennsylvania State University ("Penn State"), who owned the Quehanna Nuclear Reactor Facility from 1960-1967. It leased the site to the Martin Company from 1962-1967. The Martin Company was subsequently known as Martin Marietta Company and is now known as Lockheed Martin Corporation.

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, and 10 C.F.R. Part 9, we hereby request copies of the following materials:

1. (a) Any source material, special nuclear material, or byproduct material licenses relating to the facility.
- (b) Any applications for the above licenses.
2. Any reports, assessments, memoranda, letters, bills, invoices or other communications concerning any indemnification agreements relating to the facility provided by the U.S. government pursuant to contract or the Price Anderson Act.
3. Any reports, memoranda, letters or other communications concerning radioactive waste disposal from the facility by Penn State.

We agree to pay all reasonable fees up to \$100.00 assessed by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") in responding to this request. If the NRC's costs will exceed this sum, or if you have any questions or comments, please do not hesitate to contact me.
