These NUREG and NUREG/CR documents have been reviewed based on information in COMSECY-01-0030 (January 25, 2002) which provides the latest Commission guidance to the staff on development of criteria for release of information to the public. Based on these sensitivity reviews, it has been determined that the contents of NUREG-1725 and NUREG/CR-6695 do not contain information that could provide a clear and significant benefit to a terrorist in a potential attack. The result of the reviews (attached) has been approved by Farouk Eltawila (D:DSARE), the cognizant RES Division Director.
