I've just read an article at http://abcnews.go.com/sections/scitech/DailyNews/STRIKE_nrc_011012.html which states that certain sensitive NRC web pages have been taken down from the net. Please notify relevant people that these can still be viewed using the "cache" feature on some search engines.

I just did a google search on the phrase "nuclear facilities locations Massachusetts" and was able to locate a site at: www.nationalatlas.gov/nucleararm.html which is indeed no longer available (I saw it a few days ago)-- HOWEVER: One can still easily view this site by clicking on the "cached" link on the google results page, which sends you to this page: <http://www.google.com/search?q=cache:pDvyywbvapl:www.nationalatlas.gov/nucleararm.html+nuclear+facilities+locations+Massachusetts&hl=en> If you go to this page you will see the original page in its entirety. A determined person might be able to find sensitive information in this manner. I do not know how long Google caches web pages, but you might want to check on this and other search engines to see what can be done to pull this information.
