
Mr. Caldwell:




magnitude would make Chernobit look like a picnic.

Given the plant's abysmal safety record and its harassment of its own employees who have raised safety concerns, as reported in the April 16, 2003 edition of the Akron Beacon Journal, it would be a potentially disastrous decision to allow Davis-Besse to reopen.

Those of us who live in an area that would be impacted in the event of mistakes or plain negligence on the part of Davis-Besse, which does not seem unlikely, given your own comments in the October 3, 2003 edition of the Toledo Blade, have felt quite safer since the plant's closing. Because of Davis-Besse's shameful nonchalance in the area of safety, I can see no other motivation to open such a dangerous plant other than the fact that First Energy would stand to profit considerably from the decision. No profit margin for First Energy is worth the very real risk that Davis-Besse poses. It seems that too often we citizens have had to stand by and watch big business profit interests win out over public welfare and, in cases like this, even people's bodily health and lives. I am hoping your decision is to keep Davis-Besse closed. Thank you.

As a resident living almost is sight of the Davis Besse Nuclear Power Plant, my first concern is safety. In the event of an accident at Davis Besse we could be exposed to Radioactive Iodine which could destroy our Thyroid Glands. To prevent this we need Potassium Iodine to prevent the incursion of Radioactive Iodine into our Thyroids. Every household in a 40 mile radius of Davis Besse should have a supply of Potassium Iodide and instructions on how to use it. If there is an event at Davis Besse it will be too late to start distributing Potassium Iodide after the fact. We are all at risk without being supplied with Potassium Iodide.

The problem at Davis Besse started with a Boric Acid leak that corroded the head of the reactor. I have never heard what steps have been taken to correct the design error that resulted in the leak. Is there a solution?

During the recent power outage we learned that Davis Besse had a computer our of service that may have been able to prevent the catastrophe that we had. We have been told that that computer went out of service in January due to a virus and was not repaired or replaced. This reflects on the competence of the management. Have they or will they make similar faulty decisions in the operation of the Nuclear Reactor?

There is also the question of a cooling pump that we are told is beyond repair and must be replaced. A pump of this size does not just suddenly become damaged to the point that it must be replaced without someone calling it to attention. I have spent 50 years working in the chemical process industry and would have become aware of such a problem during my routine trips through the plant. Does the Davis Besse management ever make such a routine inspection? If they don't it is time they start.

This evening two representatives from Ohio Citizen Action were canvassing our area. We received a bulletin titled "Look Me in the Eye and Tell Me Davis-Besse Is Safe." They were gathering signatures for Nuclear Regulatory Commission as a device to disclose public concern over the safety of Davis-Besse and to urge the permanent closing of the facility!

Davis-Besse has experienced two near disasters, 1985 and 2002. After the frightening 1985 incident the first owner promised that Davis-Besse would never come close to nuclear disaster again. However as we all know now, this was an unfulfilled promise as we were 3/8 inch of steel away from a nuclear disaster in March 2002!!

It has been disclosed that Davis-Besse had not been inspected for signs of leaking coolant in five years! The four nozzles at the top of the reactor lid were obscured by insulation and also a layer of dried chemicals from coolant leaks elsewhere. Besse HAD NOT CLEANED AWAY the BUILD-UP in SEVERAL YEARS (NRC argued the residue would mask evidence of any nozzle leaks)!

As you know there are three major reasons for nuclear accident /disasters and history offers proof of the following as causes:

1. design flaws
2. human error
3. sabotage

Davis-Besse has struck out twice for close disasters! The recent one, it appears, is the result of human error at the plant... a choice to not properly maintain build-up at the nozzle heads. It also may be due to design flaws. Other nuclear reactors of the same type (ex. South Carolina reactor) had been experiencing leakage problems.

What concerns us after researching the issue of nuclear disaster vs. safety, is that NRC backed down and allowed Besse to continue running forty-seven days longer after a closure decision had been set for Dec. 31, 2002. This is a critical breach of safety precedence being set!! Paul Gunter (Director of the Nuclear Information and Resource Services- reactor watchdog project) summarized the situation: "Safety was compromised by a regulator wanting MORE but ACCEPTING FAR LESS! The American public and Congress should be extremely alarmed by this regulatory malpractice."

JUL 22 2003

Dennis Kucinich promised Senate and House hearings on the issue; he said, "This isn't just about Davis-Besse. There is clear DANGER to the health and welfare of millions of Americans."

"Regulators are NOT ALLOWED to use economic considerations to justify safety! However NRC director of licensing project management said that it would be PUNATIVE (a cost of 35 million dollars to First Energy now owner of Davis-Besse) to immediately shut down a plant, and the plant sits there a month waiting for correct inspection equipment."

Dollars of LOST INCOME SHOULD NEVER be a consideration for NRC officials' decision for a shut down. If, for example, problems are found on certain vehicles there is a complete recall for SAFETY'S SAKE! Shouldn't this SAME principle be applied to a nuclear power plant's shutdown?

We would feel much safer if the answer to that question is yes because our residence is located in ██████████ between two different nuclear power plants (Davis-Besse in Port Clinton, OH and Perry east of Cleveland, OH). We also are on Lake Erie. If Davis-Besse would have a nuclear accident, the radius of contamination would reach out into Lake Erie to at least about 16 miles. A serious nuclear accident could be devastating to the Great Lakes via the spreading radiation from the site of a nuclear accident and contamination would spread to countless areas of farmland and communities.

Humanity should remember and learn from history, the lessons of Chernobyl. Winds carried the odorless, invisible cloud of deadly radioactive material about 1200 to 1300 miles from the point of accident!

We should NEVER forget the human/ environmental sacrifice that was paid from the Chernobyl disaster. One hundred seventy-nine towns/ settlements are now empty and abandoned to this day and may remain so forever. About 135,000 people had to evacuate that region!

The massive reactor accident had economic debts as well! The reactor had to be entombed in concrete. Topsoil had to be removed from fields/ yards and sealed in metal drums. Sixty thousand buildings had to be scrubbed with brushes and sprayed. Concrete dams had to be built to contain radiated water from flowing into near-by rivers. The clean up cost was \$6,000,000,000!

Major decisions must be made regarding the post-inspection licensing of the world's nuclear power plants. Many are no longer new facilities. We must remember that cesium 137 and uranium 235, if released in a nuclear accident, has indefinite longevity (cesium with a half-life of 30 years and uranium 235 with a half-life of 700 million years)!

Do we risk the sacrifice of lives and environment possibly making it uninhabitable for millions of years due to a nuclear accident or do NRC officials and inspectors TAKE a

FIRM STAND with their decisions of how and when to close a nuclear facility temporarily or indefinitely?

Do you know how and when to prevent a strike three? Davis-Besse is already on strike two!

Each of us should imagine what it would be like to have a stranger come to our door tomorrow and tell us that we have to leave immediately due to a nuclear disaster!

Existing reactors' spent rods also continue to place a huge debt of contamination to our environment. It has been estimated that by the year 2000 there would have been more than 70,000 tons of nuclear waste that must be properly handled, contained, and buried.

It is a good omen that no new nuclear power plants have been built. Since 1979 after the Three Mile Island accident, and 59 planned reactors have been canceled.

We are concerned that strike three is prevented forever at Davis-Besse.

Please respond to the following questions:

1. What was the reason for the delay of closing Davis-Besse in 2002?
2. Does the NRC support the "principle of immediate recall" to shut down a power plant which may share a common problem of others?
3. How often should inspections take place by NRC?
4. Does NRC know how and when to prevent STRIKE THREE at Davis-Besse?
5. Does NRC support the permanent closing of Davis-Besse?



I am writing to you in regards to the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Plant. I do have concerns regarding the reopening of this plant especially in lieu of the attempted cover-up by First Energy when a hole was found within the reactor lid. It seems to me that First-Energy is losing a substantial amount of money each day this plant remains closed, which obviously does not make their investors happy. However, I do agree with you about their ability to identify safety issues. In the brief reading I have done over the last few months, I was appalled at their obvious lack of concern for safety regarding the reactor lid leak. If they are scrambling to repair and rebuild rapidly to reopen the plant, the potential exists to once again, overlook safety issues. Furthermore, once the plant is up and running, how safety conscious will they be in their attempt to make up for lost time.
