& children diagnosed with leukemia & cancer.


Some of these people have passed on. The

First Energy has made it clear from the start that they want the plant open and running at full capacity as soon as possible – not to help lower consumer costs, but to lower their operating expenses.


I am not an opponent of nuclear power by any means, but I do strongly object to a company with First Energy's lack of public welfare operating anything that is so potentially dangerous.


Thank you for your time, and I hope you truly understand how the public feels about First Energy owning and operating a nuclear power plant.

3.) I implore you to remember that my families safety as well as that of my neighbors is and should be your top priority, not First Energy's schedule.




