





Dear Mr. Caldwell,

I am writing to you as a concerned citizen of the state of Ohio, more importantly, of the greater Cleveland area. I am concerned with the pending re-start of the Davis-Besse nuclear power plant.

It seems from the beginning that First Energy's only concern was and is turning a profit. If not than any and all safety issues that have come up in the recent years would have been their top priority. Instead they publicly ridicule employees that come forward with legitimate problems and concerns. If this is the type of company that is to help usher in nuclear power to the region than maybe it is not the best idea to allow the re-start ever.

First Energy has made it clear from the start that they want the plant open and running at full capacity as soon as possible – not to help lower consumer costs, but to lower their operating expenses.

The blackout last summer is another indication of a "sloppy" way of running a company, training employees, keeping up with maintenance projects.



As a president, I find myself living in what is very close to being the exact epicenter between the Lake Erie nuclear power plants, a sort of ground zero as it were. Having said that, I would like to add that I am not an anti-nuclear power advocate in principle, the energy needs of this country are vast and require a wide range of potential sources. However, that fact does not entitle power companies to a carte blanche on their behavior.

The people at First Energy have been far from outstanding in both their business practices and their facilities operations. While I understand that there have been inroads made in the physical fortitude of the plant at Davis-Besse, there are certainly questions about the procedures and operations and the veracity of First Energy's commitment to the proper operation of its nuclear facilities. Even if the plant makes the grade in terms of construction, machinery and facilities, it must also EXCEED the grade in personnel and management. After all, you can build a Ferrari, but it's not worth anything if you let a monkey drive it.

Last summer's black out debacle and the nearly constant reports of questionable safety standards, personnel decisions and general attitude towards both government regulators and the public / customers, would indicate that First Energy is not up to the task of administering anything as potentially dangerous as a nuclear power facility. If the industry wants to see de-regulation and other industry-friendly policies survive and thrive, then they must also accept that when a level of ineptitude and disregard of public will is achieved by ANY company, that there will be consequences.

Operation of a nuclear plant such as Davis-Besse should not look like something from a Marx Brothers movie. Accountability is not only required, it is demanded by those of us who, through no fault of our own, are living in harm's way should the likes of First Energy fail their responsibilities. Mr. Caldwell, seeing that those consequences are real and that they are enforced is your responsibility. Please do not ignore it where First Energy is concerned.

Of concern also are the boric acid leaks and corrosion at Davis-Besse. Also, the NRC allowed FirstEnergy to postpone an inspection to detect cracking in the reactor head "to lessen the financial impact that would result from an early shutdown." Furthermore, according to a USA today article, the only material preventing a major release of radioactive coolant into a containment building is a 3/8-inch-thick stainless steel liner.

All of the above point to very serious safety issues and make it appear that the plant is unsafe. Until all of the above issues are addressed it seems the safest practice is to close the plant. Isn't public safety the top priority of the NRC? If so, what is being done to address these problems?
