**Subject:** CLASSIFICATION OF LES MATERIAL

Rod:

As a follow on to our discussion yesterday of controlled markings for LES documents, because LES is dealing with a uranium enrichment process the requirements of Part 95 take precedence over Part 73. In other words, information about MC&A, Physical Protection, Research, In-transit Protection of SSNM, safeguards and security, etc. could be classified as high as SECRET-National Security Information depending on the specificity of the information provided. Again, if the info does not rise to the level of classified, it still can be protected in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390(d)(1).

I'd suggest that you get a copy of NUREG/BR-0069, Rev. 2 entitled, "NRC Classification Guide for National Security Information Concerning Nuclear Materials and Facilities." I can send you a copy if you like along with a change notice to some of the items in the guide. I also suggest that you look at the LES Gas Centrifuge Plant guide dated March 1992. There are sections in there that cover Physical Security, MC&A and other pertinent topics.

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
