The National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries) Protected Resources Division has reviewed your letter pursuant to section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act (ESA) concerning LIHLA dated 2/27/104; The NRC is reviewing an application submitted by the Tennassee Yauey Authority (TVA) for renaval Of the Operating Licenses for Browns Ferry Nuclear Plants Units 1,2,3 (BFN)

We cannot determine impacts to threatened or endangered species, or designated critical habitat, under NOAA Fisheries' purview because the letter lacks sufficient information to evaluate the project.

Enclosed are guidelines to conduct a proper biological evaluation.
