NRC STAFF'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. §§ 2.730 and 2.711,¹ the NRC Staff ("Staff") hereby respectfully requests, for good cause shown, an extension of time, from June 1, 2004 to June 21, 2004, within which to file its answer to "Intervenors' Motion to Supplement the Final Environmental Impact Statement For the Crownpoint Uranium Project Church Rock Section 17." Counsel for Hydro Resources, Inc. (HRI) and Counsel for Eastern Navajo Diné Against Uranium Mining (ENDAUM) and Southwest Research and Information Center (SRIC) (collectively, "Intervenors") have both consented to this Motion.

DISCUSSION

On April 14, 2004, the parties participated in a transcribed telephone conference held at the Presiding Officer's request. The chief purpose of the conference was to discuss the Intervenors' previously-stated plans to request that NUREG-1508, the "Final Environmental Impact Statement to Construct and Operate the Crownpoint Uranium Solution Mining Project, Crownpoint, New

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Mexico" (FEIS), be supplemented to evaluate the potential impacts mining might have on a

proposed housing development (to be called Springstead Estates). Tr., at 40-68. After deciding

that the Intervenors would be required to file their motion to supplement by May 14, 2004, the

Presiding Officer indicated he would be amenable to granting HRI and Staff requests for extensions

of time to respond to such a motion beyond the periods specified in 10 C.F.R. § 2.730(c).

Intervenors served all parties with their Motion to Supplement the FEIS by electronic mail

on May 14, 2004. By the Staff's calculation, HRI's response would be due by May 24, and the

Staff's response would be due by June 1. The Staff has received HRI's Motion for Extension of

Time. The Staff agrees that additional time is necessary to meaningfully address the complex

technical matters raised in the Intervenors' Motion and the accompanying Affidavits.

CONCLUSION

For good cause shown, the Staff respectfully requests that its Motion for Extension of Time

be granted and that the Staff have until June 21, 2004² in which to file its answer to Intervenors'

Motion to Supplement the FEIS.
