#### **ADDENDUM NUMBER 1**

Protective Order Governing Duke Energy Corporation's Non-Disclosure Of Proprietary Information (April 8, 2004)

Paragraph 4 of the form of the Confidentiality and Non-Disclosure Agreement attached to the Protective Order Governing Non-Disclosure of Proprietary Information (April 8, 2004) is amended to read as follows:

BREDL agrees that any threatened or existing violation of this Agreement would cause Duke, Duke's contractors, Duke Cogema Stone & Webster ("DCS"), and/or DCS's contractors irreparable harm for which Duke, Duke's contractors, DCS and/or DCS's contractors would not have an adequate remedy at law, and that Duke, Duke's contractors, DCS and/or DCS's contractors shall be entitled to seek immediate injunctive relief prohibiting such violation in addition to any other rights or remedies. If a party is liable to the other on account of this Agreement, the measure of damages shall include any amount for indirect, incidental, consequential, or punitive damages and/or lost profits.
