ORDER  
(Granting Extension Request)

Upon consideration of (1) the June 1, 2004 motion of petitioners Blue Ridge Environmental Defense League, Environmental Law and Policy Center, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People - Claiborne County Mississippi Branch, Nuclear Energy Information Service, Nuclear Information and Resource Service, Public Citizen, and Sierra Club

– Mississippi Chapter (Petitioners) for a five-day extension of time within which to file their 10 C.F.R. § 2.309(h)(2) reply to the responses of applicants System Energy Resources, Inc. (SERI), Exelon Generation Company, L.L.C. (EGC), and Dominion Nuclear North Anna, L.L.C. (DNNA), and the NRC staff to the petitioners' intervention requests, in which it is represented that the staff does not object to the motion and that SERI would agree to an extension but only until June 8, 2004; and (2) the respective June 1 and June 2, 2004 DNNA and EGC responses to the Petitioners' motion opposing any extension beyond June 7, 2004,<sup>1</sup> it is

ORDERED, that the Petitioners' June 1, 2004 motion for extension of time is granted in that the Petitioners shall have up to and including Wednesday, June 9, 2004, within which to file any replies to the responses of applicants and the staff.<sup>2</sup>

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<sup>2</sup> Citing the Commission's August 1998 policy statement on the conduct of adjudications, CLI-98-12, 48 NRC 18, 21 (1998), both the Petitioners and applicants DNNA and EGC discuss the applicability of an "unavoidable and extraordinary circumstances" standard outlined in the policy statement to the Petitioners' extension request. Given the re-adoption of a "good cause" standard for time extensions in the recent changes to 10 C.F.R. Part 2, see 10 C.F.R. § 2.307(a), and the accompanying Commission recognition that it was "codifying appropriate portions of the Policy Statement in this rulemaking," 69 Fed. Reg. 2182, 2186 (Jan. 14, 2004), it is not apparent the more rigorous "unavoidable and extraordinary circumstances" extension standard is applicable, at least absent a Commission directive in a particular case, see Louisiana Energy Services, L.P., CLI-04-3, 59 NRC 10, 20 (2004). Be that as it may, given the unique status of these three proceedings in terms of the collective consideration they are being afforded to ensure consistency in issues admission and the concomitant need to ensure that the upcoming joint prehearing conference provides a focused exposition of the matters in controversy among the participants, as well as the lack of any appreciable prejudice that will accrue to the other participants by reason of the extension, the Petitioners' request is sufficient under either standard.

<sup>3</sup> As we have noted previously, although the Board designation notices for these proceedings established three separate licensing boards (albeit each with the same members), for simplicity we will refer to these Boards in the singular.
