Vermont Yankee and Entergy 2.206 -Corporate Corruption

I request a 2.206 on Vermont Yankee and its corporate parent Entergy.

I request that the NRC ask for the resignation of Entergy CEO Gary J Taylor for using an unethical and inaccurate push poll that deceives the public, ratepayer and stockholders. I believe he is using the well known immoral strategy -if you tell a lie over and over again -the public will think it is the truth.

If the resignation is not forthcoming, I request all of Entergy's nuclear power plants be shutdown until such time as he becomes unemployed and Entergy management is fully replaced with new blood.

This type of push polling is designed to unethically change the public perception of an issue. A poll as this is not designed to elicit the truthful perceptions of the public on a very important public policy issue. It is designed to misinform the public, the ratepayer and stockholder. Having a high corporate official using such an unethical deceptive business and public relation practice has the high likelihood of instilling a corrupt corporate and safety culture. This could have very dire and costly consequences for the corporate employees, the public, the bond and stockholders.

The issue with Vermont Yankee is that Mr. Taylor can be unintentionally and intentionally hinting to the employees that they have his permission to be deceptive with the NRC ---worst that they may be deceptive with Entergy management if their economic interests are on the line. Thus there may be hidden safety issues at Vermont Yankee and at all the other Entergy plants coming from this practice. It has the potential to instill a poor corporate safety culture at Vermont Yankee.
