HYDRO RESOURCES, INC.'S AND NRC STAFF'S UNOPPOSED JOINT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Hydro Resources, Inc. (HRI) and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Staff, by its undersigned counsel of record, hereby submits this Unopposed¹ Joint Motion for Extension of Time in response to several Motions recently filed by the Eastern Navajo Dine Against Uranium Mining (ENDAUM) and Southwest Research and Information Center (SRIC) (collectively the "Intervenors") regarding HRI's NRC license to operate an *in situ* leach (ISL) uranium recovery facility at its Crownpoint Uranium Project (CUP) in New Mexico.

HRI and NRC Staff are in receipt of two (2) Motions from ENDAUM and SRIC, both date May 14, 2004, requesting: (1) that the Commission direct NRC Staff to supplement the FEIS for the portion of the CUP encompassing the Section 8 mining site; and (2) that the Presiding Officer direct NRC Staff to supplement the final environmental impact statement (FEIS) for the portion of the CUP encompassing the Section 17 mining

site. In an order dated May 26, 2004, the Commission referred Intervenors' Motion regarding the Section 8 mining site to the Presiding Officer for his consideration.² Then, on June 2, 2004, Intervenors filed a third motion requesting that the Presiding Officer reopen the administrative record with respect to the Section 8 mining site.

HRI and NRC Staff assert that the issues addressed in both Intervenors' Motion regarding supplementation of the FEIS for the Section 8 mining site and Intervenors' Motion requesting that the administrative record for such mining site be re-opened are inextricably linked, because the Presiding Officer cannot consider new issues related to a previously adjudicated licensing action without ordering the administrative record to be re-opened. Given that the issues related to these two Motions are inextricably linked, HRI and NRC Staff request that the Presiding Officer grant HRI a time extension of seven (7) days from its current filing deadline of June 14, 2004,³ to June 21, 2004 to allow HRI to respond to each of Intervenors' three (3) above-mentioned Motions in a single Response. Further, NRC Staff requests that, if HRI's Response date is extended to June 21, 2004, the Staff's Response date be extended until June 28, 2004 in accordance

² The Commission's reference of Intervenors' Motion regarding Section 8 to the Presiding Officer places additional emphasis on questions previously raised by the Presiding Officer regarding jurisdiction over Intervenors' Motion. As such, HRI asserts that its requested time extension is warranted.

³ HRI also is required to file a substantive brief (25 page maximum) with the Commission regarding the Section 8 mining site on June 14, 2004. Therefore, HRI asserts that a time extension is necessary to allow for proper preparation and submission of this brief to the Commission.

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with the extra time provided to NRC Staff by 10 CFR § 2.730(c) (2003) (incorporated by reference in 10 CFR § 2.1237(a).
