A Survey of Waterford Residents on Taxes, Town Services, and Dealing with the Loss of Revenue from Millstone

This report reviews the key findings from a scientific survey of 1,008 Waterford, CT residents. The survey was conducted by the Center for Survey Research and Analysis at the University of Connecticut.

The survey was conducted by telephone from October 3 through October 21, 2000. Sampling error for the survey is +/- 3% at the 95% level of confidence. The purpose of the survey was to measure attitudes about town services and local taxes in light of the situation created by the sale of the Millstone facility.

A full copy of the questionnaire and results is attached to this summary of findings. Also attached is a set of data tables that break down responses by key subgroups, such as gender and age.

These are the key findings from the survey:

I. Ratings of the Town and Town Services

Residents were asked to rate the quality of life in Waterford, and most offer a positive rating. Half of residents (50%) rate the quality of life in the town as "excellent," and another 45 percent say it is "good." Four percent rate the quality of life in Waterford as "fair," and zero percent say "poor."

When asked about how the quality of life in town has changed over the past 5 years, 21 percent say that it has "gotten better" while 7 percent say it has "gotten worse." About two-thirds (65%) of residents say that the quality of life in Waterford has "stayed about the same" over the past 5 years.

In looking to the future, 44 percent believe that over the next five years the quality of life in the town will not change. The number who feel that life in Waterford will "get better" (24%) is about the same as the number who feel it will "get worse" (23%).

Residents are enthusiastic about Waterford as a place to raise a family. Fifty-five percent indicate that Waterford is an "excellent" place to raise a family, and another 38 percent say it is a "good" place to raise a family. Only 5 percent say it is a "fair" place to raise a family and zero percent say it is "poor."

When asked to rate the quality of the environment in Waterford, 28 percent say "excellent," 55 percent say "good," 13 percent say "fair," and 3 percent say "poor."

Residents give similar ratings to Waterford as a place to do business. One-quarter (25%) feel that the town is an "excellent" place for businesses to operate, half (50%) say it is "good," 12 percent say "fair," and 3 percent feel it is "poor."

In thinking about the job that Waterford town government is doing, 11 percent give a rating of "excellent," 57 percent say "good," 22 percent say "fair," and 3 percent say "poor."

In addition to an overall rating of town government performance, the survey asked residents to rate specific services provided by the town. The following shows these ratings:

II. Awareness and Concern of Millstone Situation

The survey asked Waterford residents about their level of awareness of how the sale of Millstone effects local taxes. About half (51%) of residents say they have read or heard "a lot" about this, another one-quarter (26%) say "some," 16 percent say "a little," and only 6 percent have read or heard "nothing" about this issue.

Along with relatively high levels of awareness of the situation, many residents express concern about the loss of tax revenue to the Town. Specifically, 43 percent say they are "very" concerned about this problem, and another 39 percent are "somewhat" concerned. Less than one-in-five are either "not too" (13%) or "not at all" concerned (4%).

The salience and concern about the Millstone issue is also reflected in responses to an open-ended question about the most important issue facing the town. Twenty-seven percent of residents single out the Millstone sale as the single most important issue facing Waterford, and another 16 percent say the potential increase in property taxes is most important. After these two issues, the next most commonly mentioned issue is the quality of education which is mentioned by 6 percent of residents. III. Public Attitudes about How to Deal with Tax Losses

Residents were asked a variety of questions on how the town should deal with the loss of tax revenue from Millstone. The first question queried residents on what the overall approach should be by asking them to choose which of the following three statements best expressed their own opinion:

- 1. The town should significantly increase local taxes to cover the loss of revenue from Millstone and maintain town services at the current level.
- 2. The town should not raise local taxes at all, but cut down substantially on town services.
- 3. The town should both increase taxes and cut services.

No single approach achieves majority support. The town residents are about equally divided between only raising taxes (30%) and only cutting services (31%). A plurality, however, favor a combination of tax increases and service cuts (38%).

IV. Attitudes about Taxes

Waterford residents overwhelmingly agree that they get their money's worth for the local property taxes that they pay. Specifically, 85 percent say they get their money's worth while only 12 percent say they pay too much for what they get in town services.

Also, a strong majority (77%) describe the current level of property taxes in Waterford as "about right." Ten percent say that taxes in the town are "too high," while another 10% say they are "too low."

Residents were asked about how acceptable it would be for the town to increase property taxes to make up for the loss of revenue from the sale of Millstone. Specifically, they were asked the following:

"The Town estimates that it will need to raise local property taxes to make up for the loss of Millstone. With the loss of taxes from Millstone, the town thinks it will need to raise property taxes by 6 percent for each year over the next 10 years. Would the 6 percent annual increase in local property taxes be acceptable to you, or not?"

This same question was repeated three times, asking about an annual increase in local property taxes of 5 percent, 4 percent and 3 percent, respectively.

The findings from this set of questions follows:

- One-quarter (25%) of residents say that a tax increase at any level is not acceptable.
- One-third (33%) of residents say that they would accept an annual tax increase of 6 percent over the next 10 years.
- Forty-two percent of residents say they would accept an annual tax increase of 5 percent over the next 10 years.
- Fifty-seven percent of residents say they would accept an annual tax increase of 4 percent over the next 10 years.
- Three-quarters (75%) of residents say they would accept an annual tax increase of 3 percent over the next 10 years.

The survey results, then, suggest strong majority (75%) acceptance of a 3 percent annual increase in local property taxes over the next ten years as a way to help make up for lost revenue from the sale of Millstone. A slimmer majority (57%) are willing to accept an annual increase of 4 percent. At the 5 percent annual increase level, however, less than a majority (42%) are willing to accept the increase.

V. Attitudes about Increased User Fees

Residents were asked if it is acceptable or unacceptable for the town to increase fees for certain services and permits as a way to offset the loss of tax revenue from the sale of Millstone. The following are the results of the survey:

The survey finds that a majority of residents say it is acceptable to them for the town to increase building permit fees (69%) and parks and recreation fees (58%).

VI. Attitudes about Cutting Town Services

In addition to evaluating public opinion regarding increasing taxes and fees to deal with the Millstone situation, town residents were also asked if they would support or oppose cuts in 10 specific services to help offset the impact. In no single area is there majority support for cutting services. In a number of areas, there is very strong opposition to service cuts. The following depicts these results:

Opposition to cuts in services is particularly strong in the following areas: public education, fire protection, ambulance services, police protection, snow/ice removal and refuse collection.

VII. Communicating with Residents

As the town considers various options for dealing with the loss of revenue from Millstone, it needs to develop plans for communicating with the public. The survey indicates that the best source for providing information to the public is through the <u>New</u> <u>London Day</u>. Fully 72 percent of residents indicate that their single main source of information about what is happening in town is the <u>New London Day</u>.
