

Fasset's Locoweed

Status: State Endangered, Federally Threatened.

Habitat: Fasset's Locoweed prefers shores of sandy lakes and flowers from mid-May through June. This species' seeds germinate on lake shores as the water level drops during the summer months. [Learn more...](#)
