Admission to the bar of this court is generally governed by Rule 46(a) of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure and Circuit Rule 46-1. The practical effect of these rules is summarized below:

- (a) Upon causing a case to be docketed in this court, or entering an appearance herein, an attorney so doing who is not already admitted to the bar of this court shall simultaneously apply for admission.
- (b) In order to be admitted to the bar of this court, an attorney must have been previously admitted to practice (and be in good standing) before either (1) the Supreme Court of the United States, or (2) another United States Court of Appeals, or (3) any United States District Court, or (4) the highest state appellate court of one of the states of the United States.
- (c) Each applicant must be sponsored by a member in good standing of the bar of this court. Please be certain that your sponsor is a member of the bar of this court in order to avoid undue delay in processing your application.
- (d) The court, by general order of September 1987, has set the attorney admission fee to this court at \$40. Your check or money order must be included with the application. Attorneys employed by the Federal Government and Public Community Defender Programs are exempt from the \$40 fee while employed by the United States Government or the Public Community Defender Program. However, they may apply for regular admission and pay the \$40 fee if they want to receive an admission certificate. Court employees are exempt from paying the admission fee.
- (e) Admission by mail is preferred over admission in open court. If you find it necessary to be admitted in open court, you must report with your sponsor to the office of the clerk at the time and place where the court is sitting no later than 45 minutes prior to the opening of a court session. You will need only to fill out the attorney admission card prior to being admitted in court.
- (f) In order to be admitted by mail, you must complete the enclosed form entitled "Motion for Admission" along with the attorney admission card. If these documents are not legibly completed, your application will be returned.

Counsel should also be familiar with the provisions of Circuit Rules 46-2 through 46-5, which provide for diligent prosecution of appeals; prompt notice to the court of counsel's change of address (46-3); participation of law students under supervision of a member of the bar of this court (46-4); and restrictions on practice before this court by its former employees (46-5).
