Subject: Dominion Early Site Permit Application

Bill/Jean,

NRC has received the early site permit application, dated September 25, 2003, from Dominion. As we discussed earlier, the application asks NRC to consider whether the North Anna site would be suitable for the future construction of up to 2 new units. There is no current plan to actually build the units.

The key item I wanted to get to you is that we plan to hold a public meeting near the site to explain the ESP process and to allow members of the public an opportunity to ask questions, raise concerns for us to consider, and make comments. The details of the meeting aren't set yet, so I can't give you a location or even a specific date. But if all goes as planned the meeting will most likely occur in the first half of the week of December 8. I don't know if it's too late to get this info into your quarterly newsletter. But

I'm hoping we can let folks know so that when we do announce the meeting, people are more likely to hear about it. (The announcements regarding the meeting, which will come in multiple forms, should start around mid-November.)

Once you've had a chance to read this, let me know if you have any questions or if there's anything else you need.

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) has received an early site permit (ESP) application, dated September 25, 2003, from Dominion Nuclear North Anna, LLC. The application asks the NRC to consider whether the North Anna site would be suitable for the future construction of up to two new nuclear units. The applicant is not requesting approval to actually build the units. The NRC's ESP review process was discussed at the LACA annual meeting on July 26, 2003.

After the NRC completes some preliminary reviews, the application will be available through the NRC's web page (www.nrc.gov) and at the Louisa County Library, 881 Davis Highway, Mineral, Virginia.

The NRC plans to hold an environmental scoping meeting near the site to explain the ESP process and to allow members of the public an opportunity to ask questions, raise concerns for NRC to consider, and make comments on the scope of the environmental review. The details of the meeting are not yet established. However, the meeting will most likely occur in the first half of the week of December 8, 2003. Details concerning the review process, the public meeting, and an opportunity to request a formal hearing will be provided by future notices in the *Federal Register*.
