SUMMARY OF INFORMATION COLLECTION REQUEST

Title: 10 CFR Part 110, Export and Import of Nuclear Equipment and Material: Export/Import of High Risk Radioactive Materials: Security Policies, Proposed Rule

Current Burden/Responses: Part 110: 316 hours/254 responses
NRC Form 7: 191 hours/ 70 responses

Proposed Rule Burden/Responses: Part 110: 525 hours/1,089 responses
NRC Form 7: 599 hours/ 240 responses

Frequency of Response: On occasion

Number of Respondents: 30

Reasons for Changes in Burden/Responses: The proposed rule would require that certain licensees, now generally licensed, apply for and receive specific licenses. It would also add a new notification requirement for transportation of high-risk radioactive material. The amended requirements for this proposed rule are expected to increase the average annual burden by 360 hours for NRC Form 7 and 209 hours for Part 110.

IRCAS was searched, no duplication was found.

Abstract: The Nuclear Regulatory Commission is proposing to amend its regulations pertaining to the export and import of nuclear equipment and radioactive materials. This proposed rule reflects recent changes to the nuclear and radioactive material security policies of the Commission and the Executive Branch for the import and export of radioactive material. A specific license will be required for the import and export of high-risk radioactive material.
